<u>Is your child Pupil Premium?</u>

Are you a low-income family who currently receive Income support, Jobseeker's allowance or Child Tax Credit (based on an income below £16,190)? If so, you may qualify as Pupil Premium.

What does this mean?

The school can receive additional funds to support your child practically, academically, socially and emotionally. Your child would continue to receive free school meals, even in Key Stage Two, and we pay for one club, milk, fruit snack, uniform and trips.
